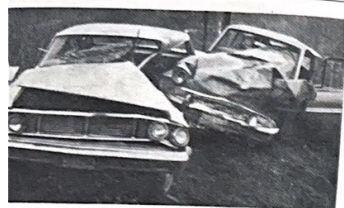

Planning Committee Appointed By Village Council

The Village Council, at its meeting last week approved appointment of a "planning committee" for the village group comprised Chair-Mike Downing and Jack Carpenter, as Council representatives, and Seiji Onizuka, Jack Ludwar and Ger-Eichel, as members of the community at large.

The function of the group is to discuss, from all points of view, proposed development of Midway as a townsite and to study specific problems such as street closures and possible industrial development and to make recommendations to the council in this regard.

The Council does not have to take the advice of such a body but, from it, hopes to get a wide cross-section of ideas as to what Midway should look like in the future.
